

So, basically my social changes will not be welcomed by anybody, and will be potentially dangerous to work on for me. I don't even want to go there too much. It's sad as there are certain rules that you have to play by, in any time, in any society. You can go against, but then you won't succeed in certain ways, as for me success is not fighting for something, but rather trying to understand and express life and myself. As our drawing teacher used to say many years ago in Moscow, 'everybody always draws himself/herself, no matter what you draw. So, I guess, I want to stay away from anything social.

I'm reading three posted responses to Manifestos (including mine), and it's amazing how different reactions to them are in three different people. It is like we are reacting to completely different themes! It's wonderful that people







A rapid social change suddenly occurred

with the virus arrival.

All familiar things became different, for everybody on the planet. What are people thinking about the enormous change in our society? How will this unusual shared human experience reflect on our future and current lives? Will it be forever different for humans? Will touch and hug become taboo with strangers? How will the 'common enemy' scenario affect the world? What can be observed from this experience?

In my project, I would like to obtain the shared experience of different people, living through a pandemic. How did their lives change? How was their life before the pandemic and after the pandemic? How did it feel to suddenly be not able to go out? What are the hopes for the future? What could be considered positive about this sudden change in society? For this project, I will be interviewing multiple people. When I was thinking about the logistics of how to choose people for my interviews, I thought that it would be a good idea to interview people whom I used to meet on a day-to-day basis before the pandemic: my friends, shop assistants, delivery people, a colleague, professor, mother of a child at school, teacher of kids in a class, soccer trainer, etc. To my mind it will reflect the reality and logistic of how the virus is spread, too. I will be doing face-to-face interviews via Zoom and interview via email-social media. Then, I will use the collected material to edit and extract some common themes or elements of connected experience form one person to another, if such themes could be found; or reflect the variety of opinions and hopes associated with the change that has occurred

Maybe I could intervew people about the effects of the virge on their lives and react on these opinions, too? The purpose of the project would be to show the interconnectedness of everything op our planet, and the closeness of all of us as human beings. Or, vice versa, to show the virus brought people apart, as there were debates about the 'fake' nature of the virus, and I know people who are very aggressively against the concept of the virus present, and against the measures to slow it down.

This time I had two winning solutions for this book, and I was hoping to use at least one of these ideas fo my final book.








I also used a papier-macher technique for the first time in my life, and tremendously enjoyed it, we were working on the book's base together with my daughter, it was so much fun!!








